For the Brigade Area Response columns, figures represent the incidents where the brigade was compliant with the relevant service delivery standard. The remaining incidents may include Code 3 responses to emergency incidents. For the Brigade Area Response columns, figures may include Code 1 and Code 3 responses to emergency incidents.
