

DESIGN A WARNING LABEL

Worksheet 23

Toys, appliances and other products you buy may contain items that are flammable.

Flammable means that they may catch on fire easily if they come into contact with flames or heat.

These items have warning labels to alert the person using them of the possible danger and provide advice on the best way to use the item.

These warning labels contain clear and instantly recognisable pictures so that they are easy to see and to understand.

Your task is to choose an item that is flammable and design a warning label. You are able to choose where the label is placed on your item, the colours used and what it looks like or what is written on it. Remember to keep your label simple and effective.

When you finish creating your label, you will be asked to present your label to the class and explain why you think your label is effective.

Examples of flammable items include

- Paper
- Wood
- Plastic
- Toys, such as dolls
- Matches, cigarette lighters
- Petrol, fuels, spray cans
