Fire danger time



Bushfire can be at **any time** of the year.



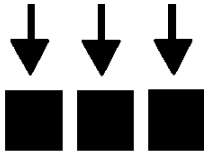
But, in Victoria,

There is **more** danger of bushfire in the warm months.



Warm months are

- October, November
- December, January, February
- March, April.



In the warm months

check the danger of bushfire every day.



Some days can be **more** dangerous.



Be careful when the day is



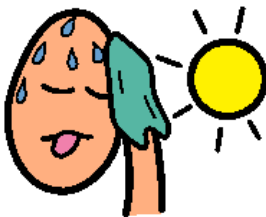
- windy

and

- hot

and

- dry.



Fires can start very quickly.

A small fire can be a big fire very quickly.



Fire Danger Rating



Have you seen this picture?

It may be a sign on the side the road

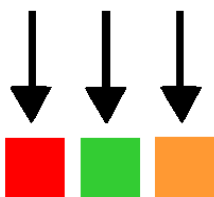
or



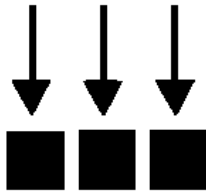
in the newspaper.



It tells you the fire danger for **today**.



Every day can be different.



Each day there is a marker on 1 of the colors.

It tells you - what the fire danger is **today**.



Here the Fire Danger Rating is **low**.

There is **less** fire danger.



Here the Fire Danger Rating is called **extreme**.

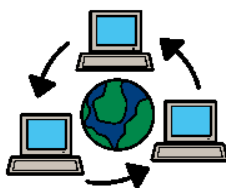
There is **more** fire danger

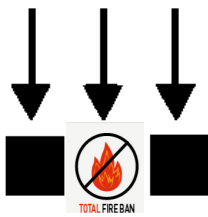

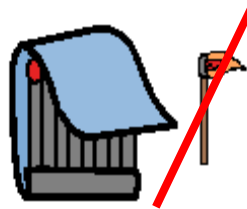

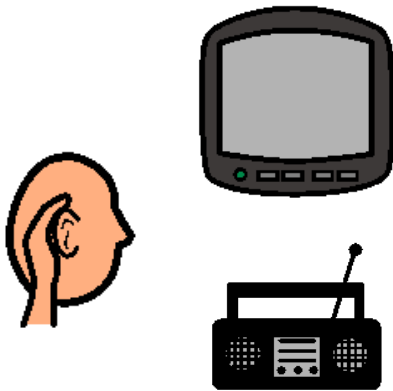

It means you can **not** light a fire.

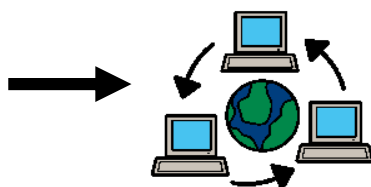


You will see it on the TV.

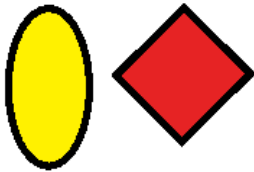

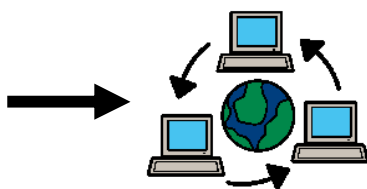
There are rules about burning off.

In your Fire Danger Time



You can **not** light a fire in the open air.



But you can ask for a permit.

Go to your CFA.



You need to know

- where is your burn off
- when is your burn off
- the time you plan to start and finish
- what you want to burn
- how big is the burn off.

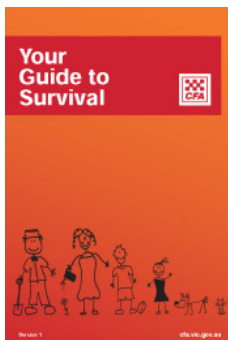
